<ul> <li>For Terms 1 and 2, the teacher enters a percentage mark that reflects the knowledge and competencies that a student has acquired - based on the evaluations carried out during the term (tests, assignments, etc.).</li> <li>In the case of English Language Arts, Mathematics and French, Second Language, a Subject Mark is calculated on the basis of the weightings assigned to the subject-specific competencies established by MEES (<i>see subject table on the first page</i>).</li> </ul>	For the 3 <sup>rd</sup> Term, the teacher enters a percentage mark that covers the student's learning as a whole for the year (knowledge and competencies).	The 3 <sup>rd</sup> term includes a Final Mark. It is calculated using the results of the three weighted terms (20%, 20%, 60%) and the MEES exam results (if applicable). *The MEES exam counts for 10% of the Final Mark in grade 6 English Language Arts and Mathematics. *Weighting of LBPSB exams to be determined (up to 10%)
